

Each child will bring home a paperback book. Please be sure your child reads the book, takes good care of it, completes the writing assignment, and packs it in his/her backpack so that it can be returned on the first day of school.

We are very excited about ending school on a positive note and are equally enthusiastic about having all students on a grade level begin school at a common starting point in September. Parents, I invite you to read the book along with your child. In this way you can experience the adventure and have a new topic to discuss around the dinner table.
